Ethic, Safety and Insurance - New Requirements, Updates and Guidelines

Speaker: Marilyn Allen, M.S.

This course covers new requirements, updates, and guidelines on ethic, safety and insurance issues.

Speaker Information: Marilyn Allen, M.S.

Ms. Marilyn Allen is a Practice Management Consultant for the acupuncture profession. Her expertise spans practice building, office management, marketing and professional ethics and jurisprudence. Marilyn is a co-author of Points for Profit, a book for the acupuncture profession in the area of business and practice management, marketing and public relations. With a M.S. in Management and Administration from Pepperdine University, she has honed her skills in several large complementary medicine clinics. Marilyn serves as the Public Relations and Marketing Director for the American Acupuncture Council. Marilyn has been a contributor to three different Oriental medicine journals and in 1999 was named as the Editor of Acupuncture Today. Marilyn is currently serving as the representative to the WHO (World Health Organization) for the development of diagnostic codes for the International Classification of Traditional Medicine. Representing Traditional Medicine providers on the Technical Advisory Group for Quality and Safety. A member of the U.S. Delegation to the International Organization for Standardization. Marilyn has been elected to the Chairman's Advisory Council. The organization is working on Public Safety and Quality and Standards for herbs and medical devices used in Acupuncture Offices. Marilyn loves to work in her garden and grows various kinds of fruit and numerous flowers in her spare time,. She also enjoys experiencing various types of Traditional and Homeopathic treatments for her research and personal health and wellbeing.

Herbal Treatment of Influenza According to Depth of Penetration

(TX: 1 biomedicine, 1 herbology | NCCAOM: 1.75 AOM-BIO)
Speaker: Dr. John Heuertz, DOM

There are over 60 formulas indicated to treat influenza in popular English-language formularies, but many of these treatments seem to prolong recovery even if managing to reduce symptoms. This course presents a simplified system for identifying the various phases of influenza and matching each phase to the most effective formula in order to speed recovery. The course combines the latest modern medical understanding of influenza and matches biomedicine

cine to classical Chinese concepts. The information of this course applies even to new strains of the virus.

Goals and Objectives:

Upon completion, the participant will be able to:

- Understand key biomedical concepts about behavior and structure of the influenza virus
- See how classical Chinese medicine concepts are actually describing what microbiology has revealed
- Accurately identify the phase of influenza infection
- Effectively prescribe the most effective herbal formulas to treat influenza

Sleep Disorders

(TX: 1 biomedicine, 1 herbology | NCCAOM: 1.75 AOM-BIO)
Speaker: Dr. John Heuertz, DOM

The Centers for Disease Control have been declaring that “Insufficient Sleep is a Public Health Epidemic” for decades; and the epidemic is spreading rapidly into new demographic groups. This course explains modern etiologies for sleep disorders within a TCM context and offers some effective treatment strategies for a number of the most popular causes, including the most important TCM patterns as well as modernly-defined disorders such as Restless Leg Syndrome, Inverted Cortisol Rhythms, and Sleep Apnea.

Goals and Objectives:

Upon completion, the participant will be able to:

- Identify TCM patterns that cause insomnia and apply the correct treatment
- Understand modern biomedical sleep disorders such as sleep apnea, inverted cortisol rhythms, and restless leg syndrome and be able to treat these with Chinese medicine.

Speaker Information: Dr. John Heuertz, DOM

Dr. John Heuertz is a prolific writer and frequent lecturer on topical issues concerning today's Oriental medicine clinician. He obtained his Doctor of Oriental medicine degree from the International Institute of Chinese Medicine in New Mexico. He has published several pieces on Influenza, written about Sleep Disorders as well as over 50 formula monographs. He has a private practice in New Mexico and does research and technical writing for Golden Flower Chinese Herbs.

Battlefield Acupuncture and Clinical Pearls Protocols and Demonstrations

(TX: 9 general | NCCAOM: 7.75 AOM-BIO)

Speaker: Prof. John Howard, L.Ac., Dipl. Ac.

This course relates to the scope of practice because all protocols taught and demonstrated can be used in anyone's clinic on a daily basis. They can be used as standalone protocols or as adjuncts to existing treatment modalities. The students learn the protocols during the didactic portions of the seminar and then see how they are done during the demonstrations and clinical observations parts of the seminar including hands on practice of inserting ASP needles. The combination of these powerful teaching methods enables the student to start using the protocols immediately in their clinics.

Goals and Objectives:

Upon completion, the participant will understand:

- Battlefield Acupuncture (BFA) and Advanced Battlefield Acupuncture protocols and what conditions they can treat
- Treatment steps and point location for BFA
- The use of ASP needles
- Treatment follow-up and ear care
- Clinical Pearls—PTSD protocol, bleeding the ear for anxiety, Piezo Pen for lactation
- Demonstration and clinical observations using Battlefield Acupuncture, Advanced Battlefield Acupuncture and Clinical Pearls protocols.

Speaker Information: Prof. John Howard, L.Ac., Dipl. Ac.

Prof. John Howard completed his degree in acupuncture from the Maryland Institute of Traditional Medicine in Bethesda, Maryland in 2004. Upon completion of his acupuncture degree Prof Howard entered into a five-year fellowship with the US military under the direction of Dr. Richard Niemtow, MD, PHD. Prof Howard is both a Clinician and an Academician. His fellowship gave him the opportunity to review and extrapolate from clinical observations and provide patient consultations at Andrews Air Force Base/ Walter Reed Army Hospital. His fellowship included working with Wounded Warriors only days removed from the battlefield theater. Prof. Howard holds two types of professorships; one in Western Medicine from George Washington University (GWU) and the other in Traditional Chinese Medicine (TCM). Prof. Howard has also authored nine books and over 25 articles on two different medical fields – Acupuncture and Auriculotherapy.
